TIM TIME:

- Parent discussion just verbally thanking Principal Williams for all she does and how responsive she is to parent concerns.
- Meeting after school today with faculty regarding the COVID-19 approach:
 - Message to the faculty was to stay open minded, don't jump to conclusions until officially notified
 - EMPHASIZED that everything isn't just "canceled" until the end of the year. We are going to keep operating like this will be lifted
 - Stay tuned to the NC School board and announcements
 - Can RHS support web-based learning/self-paced learning? Due to our socio-economic spectrum at RHS this may not be possible for our classes/students.
 - Meal accessibility
- School registration is proceeding as paced. All current 9-11 graders should have entered classes into Power School for the 2020-2021 academic year. At last count, 30 of the 110 engineering rising seniors have not entered classes into Power School.
- Check transcripts for CPR certification completion that is a requirement for graduation.

- Registration/open house for the incoming freshman families have started this week
 - We had very high attendance, 5 more sessions to go
 - Monday/Tuesday are tentatively on for the choice schools
 - o Following week, the regular Durham public schools
 - Thank-you for those parents who have signed up to assist/be here for these nights
- All 5 students who got selected for Governor's school are Engineering program kids (and all girls). 26 from DPS overall 5 from RHS.
- We've had a lot of response from the students on the summer programs that Tim has been sharing. The feedback from the programs is very positive on the interest.
- National Technical Honor Society is in transition with faculty member.
 - o More of an "academic" organization
 - Faculty member MUST nominate the student. Criteria: 3.0 GPA overall, 3 CTE classes completed with an average of at least 90.
- National Honor Society invitations went out to the current Sophomores and Juniors with minimum 3.0 GPA requirement to apply; students have to submit an application which includes teacher recommendations.
 - Service organization part of the larger national organization
- Parent Question regarding the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) College Credit for the courses
 that qualify. Based on how well the student does on the end of grade PLTW national test and also
 earns a minimum course grade of 85. Must pay a fee to receive the college credit. It is very uncertain
 which schools will transfer/accept the college credit. They do transfer as elective credits that can help
 reduce later course loads. RIT does send our STEM program \$20 kick back for every student who pays
 the college credit fee and this money is used to purchase graduation stoles for engineering students.

- May 14 would be last meeting of the year and Board Elections if anyone is interested in joining the board!
