- REPAC Executive Committee voted in a meeting one hour prior to the General REPAC Meeting on 2/13/20 to extend the REPPP contract until June 30, 2020. The remaining \$800 worth of hours for the REPPP will be used to complete a manual on how to administer the PLTW Program at Riverside (Tim Velegol's current role). - Thank-you again to all of the parents who continue to join the meetings and support not only REPAC & STEM program but RHS! Thank-you and encourage everyone to stay involved and look at your local politics and supporting public schools.

 - Just as example, there are currently 15 people on the democratic ballet for Durham County Commissioner.

 - o 375 applied for 140 seats, 174 picked as the first choice

 - Once we get the March orientation dates we will have a sign up genius to come as Parents for Questions and to sell REPAC spirit wear.

• Fall Registration starts tomorrow!

- There is a schedule posted on the front office door displaying which home room visits will be completed when.
- HUGE number of new classes being offered!
- Review the required classes and if the students are unsure of what levels they should progress to next year they need to talk to that subject matter teacher.
- Fall Final exams were successful and Thank-you to all of you who proctored!
 - Kara Robinson testing coordinator has done a great job in picking up from her predecessor
 - As discussed last month, Mr. V reviewed how the team elected to use the new PLTW ranges into the final exam grades on the fall report cards. Response seemed to be positive and understood by everyone.
 - There are still open questions on the recognition program for the stoles/cords at graduation for the seniors. Previously, there was "average" system so that you could "bounce back" from a lower score.
 - Freshman and sophomores will be in the new PLTW ranges with new programs. If your child gets a Distinguished score in the key classes and in any of other for the 4 will get the "stole" for graduation. To qualify for cords it will be distinguished or accomplished scores in any all of the 4 (any mix) will entitle student to wear the cords.
 - Just noting of the 260 tests in fall, only 12 got practice and 0 got novice. All rest got distinguished or accomplished.
 - \circ Additionally, as long as they get accomplished or distinguished they qualify for the credit.
