#### Guest Speaker:

Dr. Julie Pack-Executive Director of Career and Technical Education

Background-Dr. Pack is in her 24th year in the education field. She began as a high school history teacher before becoming a curriculum director for 6-12th grades. She has served as director of AIG and IT, as well as CTE. Dr. Pack believes that everyone is destined for a career no matter where they start. This seed needs to be planted in elementary school.

CTE is a federal and state funded program comprised of sixteen career clusters, including arts, health sciences, law, IT, and STEM, among others. Engineering falls in the STEM cluster which is growing to meet industry demand. Dr. Pack is responsible for making sure all money spent meets state and federal guidelines. She strives for efficiency, consistency, and transparency.

Dr. Pack's goal is for the engineering program to be a preeminent program that other schools look up to. One flaw in the CTE program is that it doesn't encourage CORE subjects such as ELA and History.
